This Dental service is **FREE** for children aged 0-12 years of age. If you have other children that require an Exam/treatment please contact us.

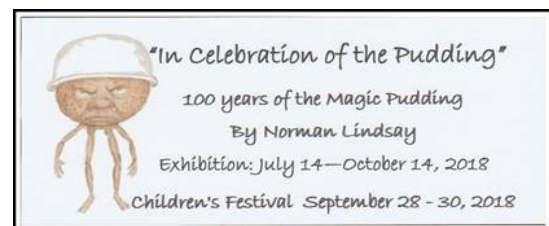
