ELEPHANT FUNDRAISER

On TUESDAY the 4th of December JSC have arranged a dress-up day to support endangered animals. Please bring a gold coin donation and dress up as your favourite animal!

We are holding this fundraiser to adopt two elephants and we will donate any leftover money to the local wildlife shelter. By adopting the elephants, we will be paying money each year to buy the elephant's food, water and bedding. We're not actually going to have two elephants roaming around on the oval...

In our class, we are doing a session each Friday called GENUIS HOUR!

Genius hour is where we pick a topic to investigate for one hour a week. We will be working on this topic of Elephant Adoption for the rest of the year. As part of our project, we have been researching endangered and extinct animals, and now we want to adopt some endangered African Elephants!

One of elephants we are going to adopt is called Musiara.

He was found by a film crew. When they found him, he was following a wild herd of male elephants with no females around, so he couldn't be fed. He was only 18 months old when they found him.

He is now about 2 years old and we want to adopt him!

The other elephant that we are going to adopt is called Dololo.

He was found submerged in a muddy dam. Dololo is a male elephant. He was born in March 2017 and he arrived when he was 18 months old. He is now 19 months old!

This will be our school fundraiser each year and we will get reports through JSC who will tell everyone how the elephants are going.

NATURE Devours ART along the

Come explore the Glenlyon Biolink walking trail along the Loddon River with local Artist Jodie Goldring.

During late October and throughout November Glenly-

on Progress Association invites the community to participate in a series of weaving activities. The focus will be getting to know plants along the river and using them to learn weaving techniques with the guidance of an experienced driet.

Some of the artworks will be left in situ to create visual interest along the trail and due to the ephemeral nature of the work will disintegrate over time.

All sessions will take place 10am - 3pm, starting from the Glenlyon Reserve Pavilion. Please bring snacks, drinks, lunch and wear clothing appropriate to the site and weather. There is no charge to participate. Everyone welcome at any or all of the sessions.

Friday Oct 26 - The Wool Crafters will work together to create a twined surface within the existing

Sunday Oct 28 - Drop in and say hello to the Artist. In the morning learn how to make string and help create an installation with it from the branches of a tree.

Sunday Nov 4 – During this day grasses will be collected and used to cobble together boats, which can be sailed in the dam or along the Loddon.

Sunday Nov 11 - Twining and random weaving techniques will be used to weave birds out of willow & other materials.

Sunday Nov 18 & Mon 19 – Finely woven nests using the technique of random weaving will be made from Iomandra Iongifolia. (With the local Craft Group on the Monday).

Sunday Nov 25 – Participants will work together to make a large wreath from plant material and hang it from a new footbridge.
