For this reason, we will be cancelling the program for 2018 and we will be looking at running a junior swimming program into the new school year, subject to the availability of Auswim Trained Staff. I am very sorry for the inconvenience but I'm sure you will agree that Trained Auswim Staff are imperative to the success of the program!

The celebrations will commence at 3.30pm and we would appreciate your providing a plate of food to share.


