We will celebrate book week on **Wednesday the 29**th **August** by dressing up and fun activities with


Drummond. The children have really been enjoying the great books that were short listed, ask them about Mopoke and Don't Lick this Book.

Newstead also has a special program with interviews, readings & art exhibitions.


