The back of winter is upon us and with it the flu season. If the kids are feeling feverish and coughing keep them home, give them lots of fluids and bed rest!

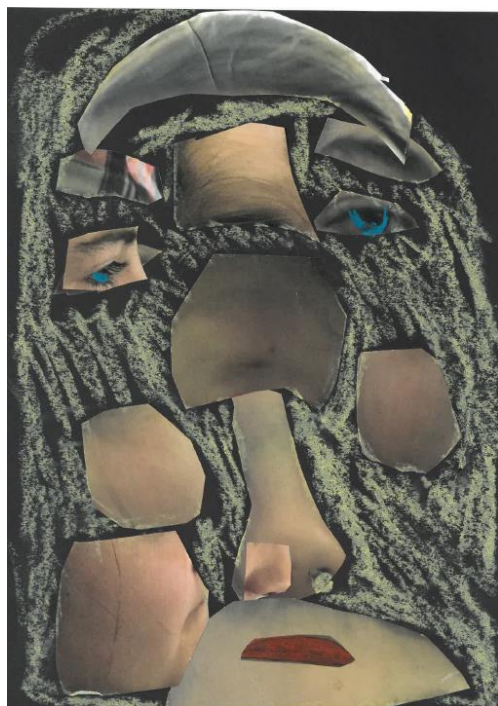

Anything but words At 7pm on Saturday August 25th, Petrus Spronk will complement the beautiful music of the Mana Moto Duo, consisting of Justine Walsh on vocals, electric guitar and loops and Adam Menegazzo on electric violin and loops, with images from his extensive travels abroad.

This event will be held at Yandoit's historical Uniting Church, one of few remaining churches in community hands across the region. Originally Methodist, the church was built of locally made brick by community members in 1878. It's a simple and beautiful church, nestled amongst eucalypts with excellent acoustics. By attending this illustrated musical event you will support not only the musicians and artist, but also the maintenance of a precious community resource in Yandoit, and the small local parish.

Cost \$10. There's plenty more events as part of the Words in Winter program across Daylesford, Trentham and Clunes during the weekends of August 18/19 and 25/26.
