#### NAIDOC WEEK 2018



#### BUTTERFLY CUPCAKES



#### Ingredients (sponge cake recipe modified):

225g unsalted butter, softened
220g (1 cup) caster sugar
4 eggs
225g (1 ½ cups) self-raising flour
2tsp baking powder
1tsp vanilla extract
lcing sugar, to dust

#### Filling

110g (1/2 cup) strawberry or raspberry jam 250ml (1 cup) thickened cream, whipped until thick

#### Method:

- 1. To make sponge, preheat oven to 180C. Using an electric mixer, beat butter, sugar, eggs, flour, baking powder and vanilla extract on low speed until well combined. Increase speed to high and beat for 3 minutes or until mixture is smooth and pale.
- Divide mixture into cupcake patties. Bake for approximately 10mins (checking at this time to see if cooked). To check insert a skewer and see if it comes out clean. Cool cakes for on a wire rack.

To assemble, cut top off cupcakes and then cut top piece in half. Spread some jam on the top of the

cupcake and then some cream. Place the two pieces on top of the cupcake – like butterfly wings! Dust with icing sugar.


