Our major literacy fundraiser is happening this week and with literally thousands of auality second hand books for sale. We invite you all to come along and grab a bargain.



- Go to a 'chill out place' and relax
- Listen to music
- Do something that makes you laugh e.g. read comic books
- Draw how you feel
- Play a computer or DS or I-Pod game
- Write a letter about your feelings
- Fiddle with a sensory toy
- Go and find someone else to play with
- Use your imagination to make up a story of where you can send your worry
- Imagine someone giving you a big hug
- Find your feeling in your body. Tense and relax this body part
- ❖ Use chill out words say to yourself 'STOP, it will be ok'
- Squeeze our your worry squeeze a ball
- ❖ Wear out your worry by running, jumping, stomping
- Practice your yoga stretches

There is plenty of opportunities to talk about fractions in everyday life that will help the children's understanding. Think pizza slices (we have eaten half the pizza), time (1/4 past, ½ to), parts of a footy field or a netball court (1/3's) and measuring cups when you are baking.

In Literacy we have been investigating advertising as persuasive text. This is helping us to use our literacy skills to become critical thinkers in our world. Take the

opportunity to discuss points of view with your children and encourage them to share their opinions with examples for support.






