

### Snippet from JSC

As we all know, this year was again impacted by COVID, however I was able to join JSC when permitted and I wanted to take the opportunity to applaud and share with you the kid's engagement, troubleshooting ideas and their planning skills.

One of the topics the kids have been tackling this year has been the impact of climate change and how they can best engage the attention of the school, families and the community.

Firstly, they came up with a Slogan:

"For our future – plant more trees"

Then we discussed how they were going to get their message across and together we came up with 4 very practical ideas.

- (1) Sharing statistics with the rest of the school at assembly

For example:

Did you know?

"48 football fields of forest are lost every minute"

"28,000 species are expected to become extinct by the next 25 years due to deforestation"

- (2) Designing posters to put up around the school to create more awareness  
(See images attached)

- (3) Organise a fundraiser

This year due to Covid we have been unable to launch a successful fundraising program, however we were able to gather some donations. This will allow each graduating grade 6 student to have a tree planted on their behalf by local organisation 15.trees. This will act as a symbolic gesture to signify the importance and impact of planting a tree can have over their lifetime. We hope this will continue every year for DPS graduating students.

- (4) A Tree planting day

We are now in discussion with the Hepburn Shire Council to organise a planting program that involves the students planting trees in and around the local area.

By participating in activities, like tree planting the students hope to bring awareness around climate change and by working together we can have a positive impact on climate change.

**Most parents don't know where to turn to when they need help with online safety issues. The rest are too embarrassed, ashamed or overwhelmed with the information out there.**

**That's where Safe on Social Tool Kit can help.**

**Some helpful information:**

Q: Any tips for when kids should start using fb, insta, etc?

**A: The minimum age recommendation is 13yrs, but kids don't miraculously mature overnight when they turn 13yrs.....so make a judgment based on their maturity, anxiety etc. Remember you will have no control over what they may be exposed to!**

Q: Will the police keep any report confidential in terms of naming who report inappropriate behaviour online?

**A: Absolutely – you can report anonymously through Crimestoppers**

Q: Any thoughts on Apple vs Android devices from a security perspective? I've heard Android is better for parental control?

**A: They are both very similar. It's a personal preference.**

Q: Are Among Us and Minecraft safe games to use? They have chat, but it seems pretty anonymous and I don't think they can't send photos, etc.?

**A: Depends on the age of the child and the version of Minecraft you are using. Among Us is fairly public so way riskier. You can turn the chat function off. Make sure you have a chat with them if they are younger to speak up if anyone ever asks them to be their boyfriend/girlfriend or tries to move them to another platform ie Roblox to Tik Tok**

Q: Once kids are fourteen years and haven't had restrictions- how can we then introduce them now 😞

**A: Remember that you are the parent. Your house, your rules. If you are paying the wifi bill or their phone bill you get to call it. Easy when they are fourteen years rather than sixteen .**

Q: How risky do you feel Snapchat is?

**A: All apps are risky if the user doesn't know how to use them safely. It depends on the age of the child and making sure that you have Safe on Social top ten safety tips in place to start.**

## QR CODE CHECK INS
